Dr. Mark Fiege is the Wallace Stegner Chair in Western American Studies at Montana State University. Born and raised in western Washington, he was educated at Western Washington University, Washington State University and the University of Utah. For twenty-two years he served on the faculty of Colorado State University, Fort Collins, where he co-founded the Public Lands History Center. His published work includes Irrigated Eden: The Making of an Agricultural Landscape in the American West (1999), The Republic of Nature: An Environmental History of the United States (2012) and National Parks Beyond the Nation: Global Perspectives on "America's Best Idea" (2016), co-edited with Adrian Howkins and Jared Orsi. He is now working on a history of the U.S. national parks and the National Park Service, with emphasis on the far West and the Pacific.
