I want to wish all of you a very Happy Thanksgiving and remember what my mom always said, "Count your blessings!"

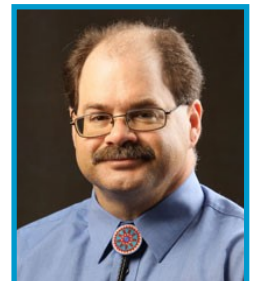
