With half of our busy September-October term yet to go, I want to draw your attention to a new speaker coming to LIFE in early December. If you like the British Monarchy and/or delightful, fun, and deeply knowledgeable speakers on the subject—in addition to all things Shakespeare—you will enjoy Carol Ann Lloyd. Carol Ann has two master's degrees (Virginia and Utah) and was the Manager of Visitor Education at the Folger Shakespeare Library in Washington, D.C before becoming a full-time public speaker. She is a popular speaker for Smithsonian, Osher Lifelong Learning Programs (like LIFE), and business leadership groups. Carol's topic for us on December 2 is "Tudor Reigning Queens." After hundreds of years of rule by kings, rule by regnant queens was unthinkable. Nevertheless, Mary and Elizabeth, half-sisters as different as they could be, ruled for close to half of the Tudor Dynasty. After them, the monarchy would never be the same.

For October, a wealth of interesting and provocative subjects await. "Grief and Anxiety in Animals" with Emilie Snell-Rood, British Life During the Battle of Britain and "A Royal Life at a VERY British Castle: Windsor" with Andrew O'Brien, "Russian Alaska" with Carol Veldman Rudie, and "China: Four Domestic Issues" with Richard Leitch. of Cod: A Father and Son's Search for Norwegian Happiness" with Eric Dregni at the International Event Center on Thursday, Oct. 28.
